

Gala Days and Special Events Milestone Anniversaries

1 Purpose of Report

This report is presented to allow Cabinet to consider a policy for any future requests from Gala Days and Special Events organisers who wish to recognise milestone anniversaries for Gala Days and Special Events with the communities.

2 Background

2.1 At the meeting of Midlothian Council on 18 March 2013 the Director Resources advised that it was his intention to outline proposals for supporting future notable Community Events.

Notably the Council supported the centenary of the Newtongrange Gala Day in 2013 with the award of £10,000 additional funding.

A request for additional support has been received from Mayfield and Easthouses Gala Day committee to support their 25th anniversary this year.

3 Additional Funding

It is proposed that funding be based on the existing grant levels which recognises small, medium and large events. The current grant levels are as detailed in the following table:-

For future milestone anniversaries it is proposed that the following levels of additional funding would apply:-

For any events that have anniversaries beyond 100 years it is proposed that reports specific to each event would be presented to Committee. The oldest event in Midlothian is based in Loanhead which started in 1903.

It is also proposed that the additional funding grant would apply where event organisers can document and demonstrate the additional costs will be incurred in support of the event.

4 Report Implications

4.1 Resource

Whilst it is for organisers of Gala Days and Special Events to determine if they are to celebrate a specific anniversary and therefore apply for funding, the following table outlines the events and the level of commitment that may be required over the next ten years.

It is proposed that based on existing levels of expenditure that the additional for Mayfield's 25th Anniversary can be met from existing resources.

Currently a review of grants to communities is ongoing. It is proposed that grants for future milestone events be remitted as part of that review.

This proposal raises the profile of Gala Days and Special Events and recognises the importance of these milestone anniversaries in the local communities.

A regular forum is held twice yearly with the organisers for Gala Days and special events. The intention would be to advise the organisers of future funding provision should this proposal be approved.
