

Grant of Planning Permission

Midlothian Council, as Planning Authority, having considered the review of the application by Mr Roy Borthwick, 48 Sixth Street, Newtongrange, EH22 4LB, which was registered on 29 August 2012 in pursuance of their powers under the above Acts, hereby **grant** permission to carry out the following proposed development:

Two storey extension to dwellinghouse at 48 Sixth Street, Newtongrange, Midlothian, EH22 4LA, in accordance with the application and the following plans:

Subject to the following conditions:

1. The development hereby permitted shall be begun within three years from the date of this permission. Prior to the development commencing the planning authority shall be notified in writing of the expected commencement of work date and once development on site has been completed the planning authority shall be notified of the completion of works date in writing.

Reason: *To accord with Section 58 and 27A of the Town and Country Planning (Scotland) Act 1997 (as amended by Planning etc (Scotland) Act 2006).*

2. Development shall not begin until samples of materials to be used on the external surfaces of the extension have been submitted to and approved in writing by the planning authority. Development shall thereafter be carried out using the approved materials or such alternatives as may be agreed in writing with the planning authority.

Reason: To ensure the quality of the development is enhanced by the use of quality materials to reflect its setting in accordance with policies RP20 and DP6 of the Midlothian Local Plan and national planning guidance and advice.

The Local Review Body (LRB) considered the review of the planning application at its meeting of 27 November 2012. The LRB carried out an accompanied site visit on the 21 November 2012.

In reaching its decision the LRB gave consideration to the following development plan policies and material considerations:

Development Plan Policies:

1. RP20 Midlothian Local Plan – Development within the built-up area
2. DP6 Midlothian Local Plan – House extensions

Material Considerations:

1. The individual circumstances of the site; and
2. Supplementary Planning Guidance – Rear extensions to single storey, terraced and semi-detached houses.

In determining the review the LRB concluded:

The proposed extension by means of its siting, scale and materials would not be detrimental to the character of the area or host building and as such accords with policies RP20 and DP6 of the Midlothian Local Plan.

NOTICE TO ACCOMPANY REFUSAL ETC.

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING (SCOTLAND) ACT 1997

Notification to be sent to applicant on refusal of planning permission or on the grant of permission subject to conditions, or

Notification to be sent to applicant on determination by the planning authority of an application following a review conducted under section 43A(8)

1. If the applicant is aggrieved by the decision of the planning authority to refuse permission for or approval required by a condition in respect of the proposed development, or to grant permission or approval subject to conditions, the applicant may question the validity of that decision by making an application to the Court of Session. An application to the Court of Session must be made within 6 weeks of the date of the decision.

2. If permission to develop land is refused or granted subject to conditions and the owner of the land claims that the land has become incapable of reasonably beneficial use in its existing state and cannot be rendered capable of reasonably beneficial use by carrying out of any development which has been or would be permitted, the owner of the land may serve on the planning authority a purchase notice requiring the purchase of the owner of the land's interest in the land in accordance with Part V of the town and Country Planning (Scotland) Act 1997
