

Environmental Health Food Service Plan

1. Purpose of Report

To request that Cabinet ratifies the Food Service Plan for 2012/13.

2. Background

The Food Standards Agency Framework Agreement defines a Local Authority's responsibilities in delivering a food enforcement service.

The Framework Agreement states that Council has a duty to provide an up to date food service plan and stipulates that "To help to ensure local transparency and accountability, and to show their contribution to the authority's corporate plan, feed and food service plans and performance reviews should be approved at the relevant level established for that local authority, whether that is Member, Member forum, or suitably delegated senior officer level."

The Food Service Plan for 2012/13 is attached as Appendix 1. An overview of service performance against the 2011/12 plan is attached as Appendix 2.

3. Report Implications

3.1 Resource

There are no budget implications arising from the Plan that cannot be met from within the existing food safety revenue budget.

3.2 Risk

Both the Environmental Health Service and the Trading Standards Service deliver statutory functions and this Plan is produced in pursuance of these functions. Failure to produce and implement a food safety plan leaves the local authority open to the challenge of failing in its statutory duty.
