Aims and Objectives			
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To deliver a one year budget reduction of £750,000 in 2018/19 by reducing the maximum permitted DSM carry-forward from 2.5% to 1%, and to deliver a £500,000 reduction in DSM allocations to schools with effect from 2019/20.			
1. Does the proposed budget saving affect people? Yes X No			
2. What is/are the reason(s) for your proposed budget saving?			
This proposal reduces the proportion of their DSM budget that schools are allowed to carry forward to the following financial year if they have not spent their entire budget. It also reduces future years DSM budgets by £500,000.			
The carry forward is, by its very nature, money that the schools have not required to spend during the budget year, and still provides for schools delaying spending some of their budget to allow for unexpected expenditure at the end of the financial year.			

Reducing the total budgets allocated to schools by £500,000 from 2019/20, will significantly reduce the amounts available for carrying forward and may result in schools employing fewer staff.

The Scottish Government is currently reviewing funding to schools and has published a fair funding document together with the Education Governance Review: Next Steps which builds on the core principal of devolving the maximum resources possible to Head Teachers. This will have significant impact on the block grant which the Local Authority receives from the Scottish Government and will come with its own set of rules regarding spending and carryforward.
