Aims and Objectives
1. Does the proposed budget saving affect people? Yes
2. What is/are the reason(s) for your proposed budget saving? The Council does not currently operate a framework panel of solicitors and social workers who can be appointed to provide reports in social work cases (curators). At present, such curators are appointed by the court with no input from the Council. Midlothian Council, in a joint working initiative with East Lothian and

Edinburgh Councils, has agreed to draw up a panel of curators to be appointed on new terms and conditions with set fee levels. The introduction of set fee for work of curators appointed by sheriff court for social work cases but paid for through legal/social work budgets will reduce the cost of court actions. There are currently no fee limits (although these may be audited by the court), Set fees would reduce these costs.

There is currently a recruitment campaign for curators to join the framework panel. This will widen the pool of available curators and open the role to social workers and family lawyers as well as more experienced court solicitors.
