## 2 2012/2013 Performance Reports – Quarter 1

There were submitted Performance Reports detailing the progress made in respect of the Corporate Plan for the Council and the Plans for Education; Children and Families; Communities and Support; Adult and Community Care; Housing and Community Safety; Customer Services; Commercial Operations; Property and Facilities Management; Planning and Development and Finance and Human Resources. Each report contained a summary of the major successes; the major challenges and the actions to address them; and the budget position and the impact of efficiencies. Thereafter, the Cabinet received verbal updates in respect of each of the reports.

- (e) To note that preparation in respect of the Government's reform of Welfare benefits was dependent on information being provided by the Department of Work and Pensions;
- (f) To note the good relationship established with the Police in respect of the management of offenders;
- (g) To note that in excess of 2,000 clients now benefited from telecare packages;
- (h) To note that in providing respite care for Carers, every avenue was explored to minimise or obviate financial hardship to them;
- (i) To note the focus of the Housing and Community Safety Service in preparing for a further inspection by the Housing Regulator in 2013;
- (j) To note that details of the numbers of households affected by the proposed "cap" on Housing Benefits would be provided separately to Elected Members; and
