		A challenge to the digital first approach has at times been the pace of change. For example, the introduction of the Single Point of Access did not allow for meaningful discussion around opportunities that digital options could have added to the programme.	
		Suggested that all new developments must evidence that digital options will be explored.	
		Digital exclusion should be recognised and understood.	
		Strategic Planning Group agreed to the proposal to adopt a Digital Governance Framework to support operational and organisational development moving forward.
